
# What is the cloud?

### Types of storage:

- Local Storage: storage on your computer's built-in hard drive.
- Removable/Peripheral Storage:
   These are devices that increase your computer's storage or allow you to save to another physical location for back up.

Examples: USB drives, solid state drive, external hard drives, CDs, etc.


Remote storage: Cloud storage!






## Where is the cloud?


The cloud is misunderstood.


Your data is not in "cyberspace"; it is being stored by Google, Amazon, etc. on physical servers grouped in warehouses called "data centers".





Data centers house rows upon rows of servers, allowing them to store and manage the data of millions of users. Data redundancy is used to ensure data isn't lost if the equipment malfunctions.





Amazon Data Center






## Advantages of the cloud

### Automatic Setup. Get off to a quick start.

Just hold your new iPhone or iPad near an iOS device or Mac you already own, and many of your personal settings, preferences, and iCloud Keychain passwords are quickly and securely imported. Or in technical terms, easy peasy.



Cloud services make it easy to set up new devices and replace missing/broken devices.



You can access your information on multiple devices, making it easy to manage important files.


Also it's not impossible for cloud services to be inaccessible due to scheduled maintance or techincal errors.



In addition, cloud services are a frequent target for hackers.



Although data leaks can happen, most attacks are a result of phishing-scammers tricking users into providing login credientals.



Remember that photo leak back in 2014? People assumed a hacker obtained the photos by hacking into iCloud, but the scammer actually *tricked* the celebrities into giving their login information with a phishing scheme.



Use long, complex passwords.
Make security questions difficult.

Use two-step verification if it's available.

Avoid logging onto unsecure WiFi networks.

Keep an eye out for phishing scams.

iCloud is a cloud synchronization software for Apple devices such as iPhones, iPads and Macs.



For users with multiple Apple devices, iCloud keeps all your information in sync, allowing you to seamlessly transition between devices.

#### Start with 5GB free. Add more as you need it.



Google One is a subscription plan that offers online storage for most Google's popular cloud-based services: Gmail, Google Drive and Google Photos.




**Google Drive** is a free service from Google that allows you store files **online**.





## 3rd Party Cloud Services


- Samsung Cloud- built into Samsung devices, essentially the Samsung verison of iCloud.
- **Verizon Cloud** preinstalled on Verizon devices.
- **Sync.com** One of the cheapest options. 5GB free, 200 GB \$5/mo, 2 TB \$8/mo
- **PCloud** Another cheap option- offers 10 GB free! 2TB for \$95.88 per year (\$7.99 per month)
- IDrive- A robust secure cloud backup service. Available for Windows, macOS, Android and iOS. Currently has a deal of \$3.98 yearly for 5TB (\$79.50 after).
- **Dropbox:** Great collaboration features and ingration with popular 3rd party services like Scrivener. (However, free device limit is 3 devices). 2GB free, 2TB for (\$9.99 per month).







**Dropbox** is a popular 3<sup>rd</sup> party cloud service.



Dropbox starts you off with 2GB of data but you can extend it by 500 MB when you invite friends.

(\$8.25 = 1TB per month, \$16.58 = 2TB per month)

### Other 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Options

- Mega: New Zealand-based company with an emphasis on security. 50GB free!
   200GB for \$6 a month, 1TB for \$12 a month, 4TB for \$23 a month, 8TB for \$35 a month
- **IDrive**: offers continuous syncing of your files, even those on network drives. Files deleted from your computer are not automatically deleted from the server, so there's less danger of removing something important by accident. 5 GB free, 2TB \$52.12 (First Year, \$69.50 after), 5 TB \$74.62 (First Year, \$99.50 after)
- **pCloud**: Strong security and ideal for large files. 500 GB for \$175 (for life!) 2 TB for \$350 (for life!).
- **Box**: Older service that is well-supported across multiple devices (there is also some integration with G Suite). 10GB free. 100GB for around \$10 a month.
- **SpiderOak**: Great for automatic backups. Claims to encrypt data before syncing (but since they haven't released the source code, it's difficult to tell). Price: 21-day free trial. 150GB for \$6 a month, 400GB for \$11 a month, 2TB for \$14 a month, 5TB for \$29 a month.
